

Parish council news

Following an enforced absence in April and May the Parish Council met on 9th June via Zoom. It was good to get together and discuss a number of important issues.

The contractor working on the restoration of the phone box was due to re-commence work shortly and we are all hoping to see the results of his work in the near future so that we start fitting it out for use as a library.

A few instances of fly-tipping in recent weeks were noted which MDDC had dealt with very quickly. I would urge anyone who sees any fly-tipping to report it on the MDDC website, so that it can be removed as soon as possible. Please note MDDC cannot deal with fly-tipping on private land.

Some of you may have noted that Robin, our village lengthsman, has recently been busy clearing ditches and drains on the road above the church which has already helped to reduce the flow of water cascading down from the top part of the hill. Whilst Robin has done a fantastic job in clearing these blockages clearly there are limits on what he

can do and I am meeting with someone from the Highways Department soon to discuss the collapsed drains and other drainage issues that are continuing to cause problems on the lower part of Bickleigh Hill and also on the hill by The Bothy. I'll provide an update in due course but, in the meantime, suggest you don't hold your breath!

Thanks were given to the Bickleigh Coronavirus Response Team for all the work in co-ordinating the volunteers who are helping those in need and which is continuing to provide a basic errand service for a number of villagers.
