

as rain beats down and temperatures are set to drop, perhaps more like normal for the time of year. With the big climate conference being held as you read this we were interested to look back at the history of a potential warming world due to carbon dioxide.

Amazingly in 1856 Eunice Newton Foote raised questions about the effect of gases and sunlight and postulated that gases such as carbon dioxide may induce a warming effect. It was not until 2010 that her pioneering work was recognised. John Tyndall followed with more work relating the build up of greenhouse gases and the effect on our climate. His early work is recognised at the Tyndall Centre in the University of East Anglia.

We have therefore been warned about the dangers of fossil fuels for well over 100 years, so we can't say we were not warned. The latest science suggests we have left it too late and the next 100 years may now be catastrophic with a runaway climate change.

Despite this gloomy message we wish you a good November!



Thoughts from Clive

Whilst in London recently visiting family, my wife and I spent a day at Greenwich where we took in the Royal Observatory and the National Maritime Museum. Whilst the museum is a fascinating place and full of interesting artifacts and exhibitions about Britain's naval seafaring heritage it was the Royal Observatory that I found the more interesting and memorable. There was a particular section on the ships that had foundered off the coasts of Devon and Cornwall simply as a result of not knowing where they were. Unable to establish longitude they had to rely on estimating their position as best they could. It wasn't until the invention by John Harrison of a timepiece that could be effectively used onboard a ship that the problem was solved, and thousands of lives were saved as a consequence. John Harrison had spent many years trying to come up with a solution to the problem of using pendulum clocks on the rolling deck of a ship and it was only his dogged persistence that eventually saw him design an early pocket watch that was unaffected by a ship's motion.

I can't say I'm particularly blessed with dogged persistence but you've got to admire those people who simply will not give up or take no for an answer.

Which brings me nicely to Christmas and 8 words that I just dread to hear at this time of the year — 'What are we doing for Christmas this year?' I'm not suggesting that dogged persistence has a big part in our family's Christmas but let's just say that certain rules need to be born in mind. There are rules around present giving, who's turn it is to host the Christmas and Boxing Day

lunches and even what games must be played! I'd better say no more!


