

## **Bickleigh Charities**

A bit of a delve into the local archives this week, which I hope you enjoy.

Having recently taken on the role as the Treasurer of The Bickleigh Charities, I thought I ought to find out a bit more about its background and what an interesting path that has led me down.

The current charity is an amalgamation over the years of a number of local charities with the sole aim of providing relief or support to the poor of Bickleigh. But it goes back as far as 1673 when a John Lovell gifted land with 2 cottages on it, called Collishayes, together with half an acre of the share of grass grown on a field known as Hawke's Meadow. This raised about £3 a year for shirts, stockings and shoes for 15 poor people in Bickleigh and distributed on All Saints Day each year. In 1883 part of the land was sold for the improvement of the turnpike road to Tiverton and in 1889 the charity received compensation for land taken by the Exe Valley Railway.

In 1708 a lady called Anne Crockford gifted land of nearly 4 acres, called Ware Park in Cullompton, to 4 individuals who later in 1714 transferred the land to Sir Thomas Carew, whose surname will be familiar to many Bickleigh residents. The annual income from this land was to be distributed at Christmas to the poor of Bickleigh for linen, cloth, hose and shoes. In 1811 the sum of £100 (equivalent to £9,500 today) was added to the trust by Rev. J W Carew from the sale of timber grown on the land.

Sometime before 1852 the Rev. R B Carew founded the 'Charity for the Poor' using the sum of £20 that had been entrusted to him and in 1868 John Carew left £100 in his will for the benefit of the poor of the parish.

In 1898 the first 3 charities were combined into one with 3 of the 6 appointed trustees appointed by the Parish Council.

In 1930 the 3 combined charities plus the John Carew charity made a new Governing Document changing who could benefit from the charity and in what ways. In future it decided that payments could be made to the poor of the parish and who were 'conducive to the formation of provident habits' and specifically for medicines, medical appliances and other medical needs - bearing in mind this was before the formation of the NHS. In addition, clothes, boots, bedding, fuel, tools and food were also provided. Interestingly, the trustees insisted that assistance could only be provided after a full investigation of the character and circumstances of the person!

In 1952 the charity was reprimanded for making a contribution to a children's outing as this was deemed not in keeping with the terms of the trusts.

Nothing much happened until 2005 when Ware Park was sold and the money raised invested in order to continue to provide an income to meet the needs of the parish.

To this day, the trustees meet at least annually and continue to follow the rules established in 1930, albeit in a more modern and holistic way, and a notice is placed in the Bickleigh Bugle and elsewhere each year requesting nominations for those in financial hardship.

I think it's great to think that something started by a kind-hearted citizen over 300 years ago is still active and basically doing the same work as originally intended. It would be nice to think that at some future date the charity won't be needed but I can't imagine that will be any day soon!

I am very grateful to Olive Taylor for providing all the historical documents, of which this is the briefest of summaries, and to Judith Williams for doing all the research and establishing a logical timeline of events.

In Bickleigh, we are very lucky to have a fantastic village hall facility. Up until the pandemic, we (the Village Hall Committee) ran events through the year.
