"LEST WE FORGET" -

A difficult belief of the Christian is that in order to live we must die to self. The four hundred year old poem below, plaintive yet hopeful and etched into Elizabeth's tomb within St Mary's Church Bickleigh, carries with it the theme of self sacrifice and the practical working out of the spiritual life in an age apparently so different from our own. What we do now or, do not do now, has effect well beyond our own mortality. That much has not changed.

"CAREWS DAUGHTER, ERISEYES WIFE,
ELIZABETH THAT HIGHT
EXCHANGED LIFE FOR DEATH TO GIVE
A SOONE THIS WORLDS LIGHT
TO GOD SHE LIVED IN GOD SHE DIED
YOUNG YEERD IN VIRTUES OLD,
AND LEFT UNTIL IT RISE AGAINE
THIS TOMB HER CORPS TO HOLD"

In the 21st century, Remembrance (that is being present during two world wars) must give way to "Lest we Forget" since many of us now were never there. We can hardly claim peace in our own time when we witness the plight of millions fleeing and suffering from the awfulness of brutal conflict. Yet we try not to loose the hope for peace and reconciliation. Peace leads to reconciliation or should. These will be themes in our Service of Remembrance in St Mary's on **Sunday 11th November starting at 1055 am**.

A daughter tells me that during the practice of being evacuated from her city home to the countryside in 1939, war was declared against Germany. She never saw her mother again until much, much later. The practice became a searing reality. How many of us now are really interested in such vivid memories or even the lives of the men who died for "King and

Country" and whose names are recorded on a brass plaque inside our parish church?

BICKLEIGH SCHOOL

A feature of Bickleigh School (and many others) is an adherence to good traditions of the local community. Remembrance is one of those. Not only do they have their own service but join with villagers on the Friday before Remembrance Sunday in a simple act of remembrance followed by refreshments in the village hall. On this occasion we hope to hear some World War 2 poetry written during the greatest conflict the world has yet known. In this centenary year the school will also support our service in St Mary's church on Sunday 11th November.

Classes 1 and 3 have been into St Mary's Church recently to learn something of the church and its history (Class 1) and the place of Baptism as a sacrament in the Christian life (Class 3). Two very happy occasions when young children ask the most surprising and thoughtful questions.
