AN INTERREGNUM? - As many of you will know we said good-bye to Alan on the 6th January at his final service in St Mary's Church, Silverton. It was a wonderful service reflecting his commitment to our Parish and the other three parish communities for over 23 years. Now that he has retired we are in a time of "interregnum". What is this I hear you shout, and I don't blame you it means simply in a period of time between the retirement of Alan and the arrival of the next incumbent. This may take several months to achieve. In the mean time the Reverends Thom Thompson, Catherine Jenkins and Judith Wright will continue to leadd worship in the four parishes that make up our United Benefice (Silvertom, Butterleigh, Bickleigh and Cadeleigh).

This means that potentially, some changes in the timing and style of services here in Bickleigh may be needed. We have an opportunity to think about how we as a group of people explore our faith together, whether you are coming from a life time of church going to never stepping into a church and having no faith but a lot of questions; we need to hear from you and process is just beginning.

We will be making a concerted effort to keep our website (https://www.achurchnearyou.com/church/8834/) and the wardens blog up to date during these changes so people know what time and type of services are happening without having to walk all the way up the hill to find out.

It is a sad time as we say goodbye to Alan but we are also excited in what the future may hold for us all.

Easter 2019

We approach the Christian season of Lent. The word Lent is associated with the lengthening of the day in spring and the word is probably of German origin. This Christian season lasts some forty days from Ash Wednesday on the 6th March to Easter Day on Sunday 21st April. Shrove Tuesday, which precedes Ash Wednesday, is so called because in former times Chrsitians submitted themselves to their local priest who would absolve them of their sins. Nowadays it is more associated with pancake races; which Bickleigh School are planning to conduct in the afternoon.

Easter Tide Services

Ash Wednesday 6th March at 10 am – A service of Holy Communion (Ash Wednesday because in the early Chrsitian church penitents covered their head with ashes. Now a cross of ashes is placed on the forehead, a voluntary act. The ashes being taken from burning the previous year's Palm Crosses.)

Mothering Sunday 31st March at 11am – A service for the whole family with gifts of flowers and posies made by children or donated. Now generally referred to as "Mother's Day" a service to celebrate both our mothers and the church as mother. In the case of the latter very often in former times returning to the church where you were baptised.

Palm Sunday 14th April at 11am – A service for the whole family. The service celebrates the final journey taken by Jesus of Nazareth into Jerusalem. The form of service is an encactment by the congregation of Jesus' triumphant arrival followed by his arrest, trial and execution.

Good Friday 19th April at 2.30pm - At St Mary's Silverton - "The Cross of Christ". A moving service of hymns, music and biblical readings as we follow the journey of Jesus to his execcution

Easter Day 21st April at 11am - A service of Holy Communion

CHRISTOPHER HUGH PRENTIS RIP

Chris Prentis died in the RD&E Hospital Exeter on the 28th December last year. Born into an Army Family, most of Chris' education was in the UK, with holidays spent In Kenya, Egypt or Germany. From school, Chris gained entry to the Royal Military Academy Sandhurst, followed by a Commission in the Royal Highland Fusiliers. He joined them in Malta in early 1961. Two years later he moved on to Germany where he passed the tough selection and training procedures for secondment to the Army Air Corps. He then flew helicopters during the Borneo Confrontation and later, in Hong Kong. Chris then resigned after some ten years service.

By this time he was married to Joanna and they decided to explore and prepare for possible farming in Western Australia, finally settling on a property in the Albany area. This with some 4000 acres, 2000 of which had been cleared. On their first arrival at the property they had one neighbour who was very anti Poms, yet when they were leaving he shook Chris warmly by the hand saying 'Chris you're not too bad for a Pom'. Chris saw this as a very big compliment.

After ten years they moved back to the UK, and settled at Burnhayes, creating and developing their Burn Valley Trout Farm. When seeking a garden Trampoline for the girls Chris found it hard, until sourcing one from Australia. He saw some potential for starting a UK business. Steadily it became a reality on what became Supertramp,

with parts sourced from Australia and later China. Chris became known as "Mr Bounce". However, competition became stiffer and profits harder to achieve. Restructuring, Chris stayed in a Consultancy and Marketing role which continued in recent years. The flood of comments and tributes that poured after Chris' untimely death gave great testimony to his character and contribution.

Chris loved his outdoor activities, whether skiing, tennis, biking or canoeing. Chris was above all humble and unselfish. Outgoing in an enthusiastic and fun way, an Adventurer and Pioneer in so many different arenas. He faced up to setbacks bravely and uncomplainingly and had great stamina. He was excellent in a crisis and always ready for the next adventure. He looked at things in a different, or alternative way, loved a challenge and helping other people. He was always ready to buck the system.

Mr "Bounce" was a gentle, caring man in every sense
