

Village Hall AGM

I meant to put this in last month, but forgot It is my report from our AGM in July.

It has been a busy year at Bickleigh Village Hall. In terms of the condition of the building, we arranged for a new floor to be laid. Although this turned out to be more expensive than originally predicted, due to the condition of the sub-floor, it has improved the building greatly and made it safer (due to it's grip), warmer (due to the damp-proof membrane and hence more desirable for hiring out. Committee members kindly gave their own time over the summer to re-paint parts of the hall walls and the stage blocks and following this, there were three Saturday morning work parties through the year for which we were very grateful to committee members and locals turning up to help. We have maintained the outside of the hall to a good standard and

having a condition survey and improvement plan, this will help with prioritising need for inside and out. A significant move forward has been the revival of the outside play space, and the preparation and planting of a border hedge between school and the Village Hall.

There have been a number of events at the Village Hall over the last year, arranged by the committee. We have held two chocolate bingo nights, a film evening, two quiz nights, a New Year's Eve party, a gig (with the Embezzlers) and a Hidden Kitchen event run by Jim Janes. These have been well supported, but maybe we need to improve our publicity- arranging for our own group Facebook page could be a good way forwards.

Our committee has lost two valuable members recently- I would like to publicly demonstrate my appreciation for the work of Kerry Peters, who was the driving force in the Village Hall being re-roofed and having a new kitchen fitted. Also Derek Harrison who represented the PCC on our committeegiving 22 years service to your community is quite some achievement.

I would like to thank the ones still standing on the committee for their fantastic work and dedication over the year- Michelle, Matt, Lauren and Steve- you are the heartbeat of the village- your magnificent efforts keep our community going.
