Having served as Chair of your Parish Council for 24 of the 29 years living in this village - and as it happens, clerk for most of that time - I have decided the time has come to stand down. Three other councillors — Mrs. Jill Brownlow, Prof. Adam Scaife and Mrs. Jacki Platt are also standing down.

Unfortunately, when the recent notice of election was published, no nominations for councillor were made, so we no longer have a Parish Council. My understanding is that MDDC will appoint two district councillors and one county councillor on an interim basis to act as parish councillors and that they will need to recruit a clerk, as there is also now no clerk.

Probably at some point in the near future, a further notice of election may be published by the District Council, calling for nominations to form a new Parish Council. If then - and again -

insufficient nominations are forthcoming, Parish Council business cannot be transacted and your Parish Council may be dissolved – SO YOU WILL LOSE IT!!

I am sure most of you will agree that having the Parish affairs run by outsiders, which is what the appointed personnel will be, albeit that they will do their best, is not the most satisfactory of situations, far better for the Parish's affairs to be handled by our own.

Being a councillor does not on the whole take up much time, so come on some of you, join Mrs Amanda Somerwill who is happy to remain a Parish councilor, consider standing and do something for your community as and when the time comes, for it would be a great shame if this Parish's collective voice were to be lost.



A meeting of parishioners is then held. At the meeting one of two options well be tabled. One option is to return to the system we have had over many years. The other is to opt for a simpler arrangement an example being that adopted in Cadeleigh Parish. This being so and speaking

personally I think the latter option is now more suited to our needs. What do others think?



May I thank all of you who came out to vote in the District Council Election on May 2nd, however you voted.

After a campaign lasting some two months, in which residents were treated to visits on the door from both myself and Gavin Donovan, I was re-elected for a fourth term to represent Cadbury Ward.

Of the 42 District Councillors elected this time, 18 were Conservative, 12 Liberal Democrats, 10 Independents and two from the Green Party. I have been elected Leader of the Independent Group.
