

# St Mary's Pews News

Advent - At the end of the month the universal Christian church moves to the beginning of its 'New Year', the season of Advent, the coming of Christ. The season starts on the Sunday nearest St Andrew's Day which in 2019 falls on Sunday the 1st December. Advent, from a Church of England perspective is a season of expectation and preparation, as the Church prepares to celebrate the coming of Christ in his incarnation, and also looks ahead to his final advent as judge at the end of time. The readings and liturgies not only direct us towards Christ's birth, they also challenge the modern reluctance to confront the theme of divine judgement:

The Four Last Things - Death, Judgement, Heaven and Hell – have been traditional themes for Advent meditation. The characteristic note of Advent is therefore expectation, rather than penitence, although the character of the season is easily coloured by an analogy with Lent. The anticipation of Christmas under commercial pressure has also made it harder to sustain the appropriate sense of alert watchfulness, but the fundamental Advent prayer remains 'Maranatha' - 'Our Lord, come' (1 Corinthians 16.22). Church decorations are simple and spare, and purple is the traditional liturgical colour. In the UK, the Advent season falls at the darkest time of the year, and the natural symbols of darkness and light are powerfully at work throughout Advent and Christmas. The lighting of candles on an Advent wreath was imported into Britain from northern Europe in the nineteenth century, and is now a common practice.

**Christingle** - The Moravian custom of the Christingle has similarly enjoyed great success in Britain since the latter part of the

twentieth century, with the encouragement of the Children's Society. Bickleigh School's own service takes place in St Mary's Church in the afternoon of the Wednesday the 11th December.

Men's Breakfast 9th November — It is our turn to host the Mens' Breakfast on this Saturday morning at 8am. Our guest is the Revd. Ed Channing. Ed trained as a GP in the NHS and spent a lot of his working life as a doctor in the North Devon town of Bideford. Ed is well known in many circles for his commitment to the necessary training and experience required to become a much respected Spiritual Director. The title of Ed's talk is: "To be a pilgrim".

**Bible reading** – we continue to read and discuss "Women of the Bible" on our Thursday evening meetings at Gable Cottage from 7.30 pm to 9 pm. All welcome – a very interesting and revealing set of characters.

#### Remembrance 2019

10th November – The annual Service of Remembrance takes place in St Mary's Church Bickleigh on Sunday 10th November starting at 1055 am. We are pleased that the Chair of the Parish Council has kindly agreed to lay the wreath with other Councillors attending as well. Their presence will be a first for Bickleigh in recent history.

11th November - Remembrance Day, the 11th November, will be marked by a short service in Joan's Orchard attended by pupils and staff from Bickleigh School. All are very welcome to attend. We aim to mark the two minutes silence introduced and concluded by the tolling of a church bell.
